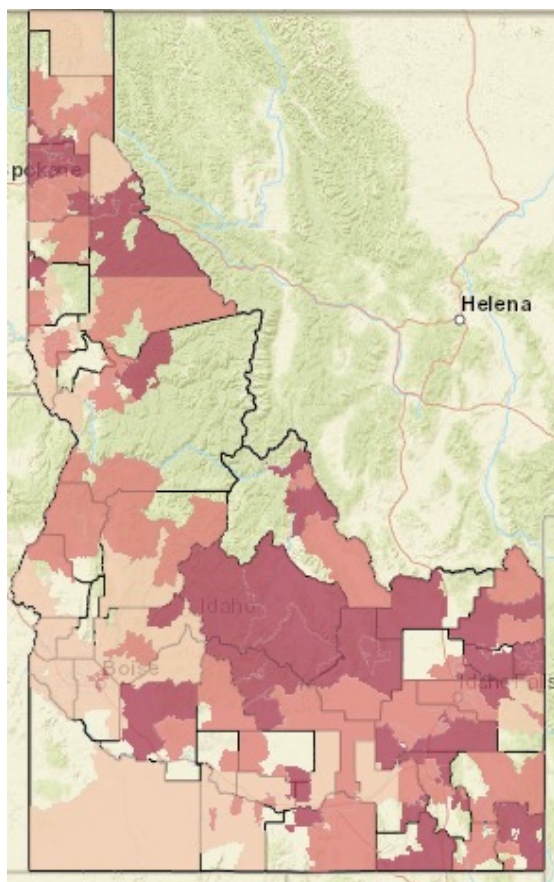
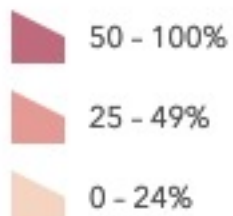

Radon Facts

- Approximately 2 out of 5 homes have been tested in Idaho have radon levels above 4.0 picocuries per liter (pCi/L).
- High levels of radon have been found in every county of Idaho.
- Idaho offers test kits for free or at a reduced cost.
- There are some federal programs that may be used to help fund radon reduction in homes for limited income families.
