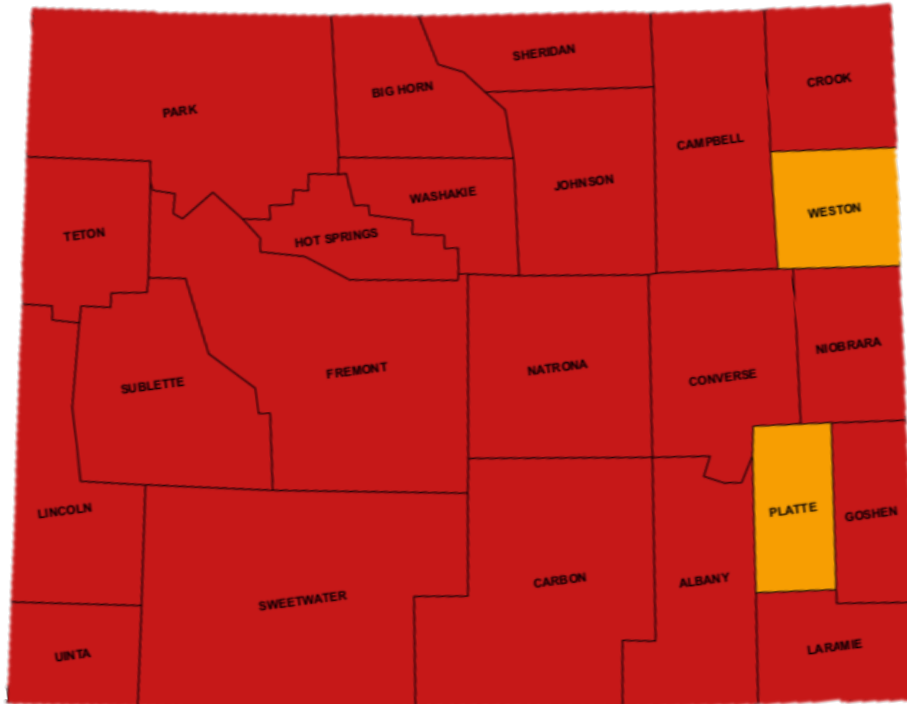


Wyoming Radon Fact Sheet

Prevalence of Radon in Wyoming:

- A majority of Wyoming qualifies as Zone 1, and is predicted to have an average indoor radon level at or above 4.0 picocuries per liter (pCi/L).
- Only two counties fall in Zone 2, and those two counties are predicted to have an average indoor radon level above 2.0 pCi/L.

Test Kits

- Provide free test kits (while supplies last) to Wyoming residents.
- If the test kits finds elevated radon levels, residents are encouraged to find a radon service provider through the National Radon Proficiency Program (NRPP) or the National Radon Safety Board (NRSB).

Legislation

Wyoming does not currently have statewide enacted or proposed legislation regarding radon. One county, Teton, has adopted Appendix F (Radon Control Methods) from the International Residential Code in 2004. In addition, 18 townships have adopted Appendix F.
